I created a new customized theme for our intranet using a clean template so that we can show the client the product in use.</p> <p>I customized Sharepoint for Engavet and designed few concepts for the Homeless Agency. We're planning to create at least 3 or 4 intranet/extranet websites for our clients in the next few months, starting from my new clean theme and customizing it using CSS.</p> <p>Working with a team of 2 people, reporting to the Technical Director. Description	<p>This is one of the biggest projects I worked on in my career. The Revenue site counted something like 5000 static pages and we rebuilt it with a new design, reorganizing content and the Information Architecture (reducing the pages to 2000) and improving accessibility and usability to better meet users' requirements.</p> <p>I came into this project when it was already started. I helped the guys to bring it forward, giving them some useful suggestions to improve our workflow and the quality of the site itself.</p> <p>The design had been already signed off when I joined the company and the XHTML template and main CSS were already done. I helped them to migrate all the content from the old site (2000 pages), fixing the structure, tidying up the code and solving all the CSS bugs. I also created a new CSS for both the high contrast and print versions.</p> <p>As it is a public site it has to be accessible by law (at least AA compliant). I also took part to the accessibility tests c/o CFIT (http://www.cfit.ie).</p> <p>The site is now up and running at the following address: http://www.revenue.ie</p> <p>Working with a team of 10 people, reporting to the Technical Director and Project Managers.</p>

Role	My goal was to plan, design and develop accessible and user-friendly web interfaces for the front-end of our booking engine system.

Description	<p>Ruby On Rails based, the system is highly customizable. It uses skins to manage liquid templates, CSS, images and scripts. We used to create a skin for each of our clients, trying to keep the look and feel of the client's website. That means that the main frame structure comes from the original website, while the main content area is the one I designed and coded to match the original style of the site. Each project could require various features or different steps to get to the reservation (results grouped by property, by category, simple results, different search options, additional packages, promos and so on). The rooms manager has been developed into two different versions: stand alone and Opera Web Suite interfaced version which use slightly different skins.</p> <p>My goal was to ensure the usability and accessibility of the whole booking process. I designed the steps in Photoshop (searching panel, searching results showing availability, rates and prices, calendar view, selection of options and details, payment screen, confirmation page, contact us page, error and validation messages), developed the liquid files (just the HTML bits, the liquid functions are developed and modified by professional developers) and set up the CSS. Testing was part of the process.</p> <p>A nice and user-friendly feature I've implemented is the form validation. Role	My goal was to re-plan, re-design and develop an accessible and user-friendly web interface for the back-end of the booking engine system.

Description	<p>The system was developed during 2007 by two Ruby On Rails developers. When I joined the company a lot of features had already been added and others still needed to be implemented. The back-end interface was basic and really hard to use. The goal was to re-plan it trying to provide an easy-to-use and action driven interface, which could help the user to complete his tasks faster and with more satisfaction.</p> <p>I designed the main template trying to keep the layout very clean and clear. I've used light web 2.0 style colors to create a strong and consistent visual hierarchy, in which important elements are emphasized. I've also downplayed all the distracting design elements in order to help the user focusing on the key elements of the page.</p> <p>The second step was to work close together with the developer in order to implement the design into the system. We changed the back-end interface bit after bit. I created the HTML and CSS code and he modified the system code in order to fit the new design.</p> <p>The new back-end implements a lot of cool ajax features, which have the aim of improving the user experience. Just to make a few samples, we used a Flickr.com style ajax feature which allows the user to edit text fields simply clicking on the text itself (when the user click on the text area, text become an input field), another ajax script which allows the user to expand and collapse a full page width searching box and search through all the items, another one that manage the calendar view of the room availabilities, which works more or less like Google Calendar and so on.</p> <p>As soon as the first version of the new back-end was ready, we set up some usability tests in order to spot the main usability issues. We asked 5 people (non-technical persons) to navigate through the system and run some tests (mainly achieving predefined targets). Once we spot the common errors or the main difficulties we modified the system in order to solve them out. Other usability tests will be conducted later on.</p>

My template has been then CMS'd by one of my colleagues. For the same client, I did also the design and the template code for the Isaacs Hostel Dublin website (http://www.isaacs.ie/isaacs_hostel/), one of the coolest hostel in Dublin city centre. I designed the website and built the XHTML/CSS template. Since the site is mostly dedicated to young people, the goal was to create a young and fresh design. Also this one has been then CMS'd by one of my colleagues.

Kinsale Garden Suites (<http://www.kinsalegardensuites.com/>)

The Kinsale Garden Suites website has an elegant design based on a black and dark grey colour palette. The cool timed slideshow gallery in the header has been done using the JonDesign's SmoothGallery 2.0. I worked on the design and the main template. The site has been then CMS'd by one of my colleagues.

Clioma (<http://www.clioma.org/>)

Clioma's aim is to find and develop innovative climate response projects in Southern Africa that are locally driven. First of all I had to design the logo. The idea was to create something related to both the environment and the energy concept. After that, I designed and implemented the website's layout, keeping in mind the same motif. The result is a clean and fresh site for a smart new Irish company. The site has been then CMS'd by one of my colleagues.

HTML Newsletter

I designed and created the template of some of our client's newsletters. We use the MailBuild online service (<http://www.mailbuild.com/>) to provide the newsletters. After creating the design, I chop it and build the template using the proper tags and variables required by the system. Testing on different mail clients is part of the process. I created newsletters for clients as Arlington Hotel, The Grand Hotel, Clayton Hotel, the Dublin's International Comedy Club, etc.

Description CssGlance is my website, conceived and created together with my friend Roberto (80.000 visitors and 250.000 visited pages in the first year). The site is self-financing thanks to the incomings from Google Adsense and other advertisements.

It's the first Italian website focused on providing its audience with a huge database of well designed and innovative CSS based websites from all over the world. The aim is to show that good design and web standards are two sides of the same coin.

The site is Wordpress based and offers updated resources and interesting articles. We highly customized Wordpress in order to get the design and the features we need. Each website we add to our CSS gallery is carefully evaluated and categorized by content, color palette, number of columns, type of layout, type of menu, possible interesting features, CMS platform and nationality.

Even if it is a big commitment to keep it daily up-to-date, I'm very proud of this site. It's a good chance to stay up-to-date with the last international web design trends. The pure CSS MiniAdv banner (<http://www.cssglance.com/news/pure-css-miniadv/>) is one of the interesting features added to the site. The 10th of Feb 2009 we released a new version of the site (it still needs some cross-browsers fixing but it's up and running!)

Project name **City of Turin's Website updating and maintenance** (<http://www.comune.torino.it>)

Role My role was to design, develop and update the City of Turin's website and quite a number of sub-sites.

Description	<p>The City of Turin's website is the official site of the City of Turin (city with 1 million inhabitants). It's a really huge site which contains information about the events in the city, the major and the city council departments, citizens information, tourist information and so on, in 7 different languages (Italian, English, French, Spanish, Arabic, Romanian and Albanian). It counts over 180.000 pages and about 18 millions visited pages in 2007. Four web designers and content managers and three developers composed the team.</p> <p>My role was to keep the homepage and all the site sub-sections up-to-date (I used to get the news from the press releases and the main updates straight away from the departments). Besides, I had to plan, design and develop new sub-sites (for events, departments, services, etc.) keeping in mind the accessibility and usability W3C guidelines. Since it is a public administration's site, it has to be accessible by law. The Italian law in matter of accessibility (no. 04/2004) refers to the international W3C web standards (WCAG 1.0, UAAG 1.0, ATAG 1.0, Section 508).</p> <p>The ability to make quick updates and fix issues, even under pressure, and the strong attention to details were essential requirements. In fact, since the site has a lot of visitors and since it is the official site of the city, even the smallest error on the homepage or on one of the most important sections could have brought major problems.</p> <p>Here are just some samples chosen among all the projects I did for the City of Turin's website.</p> <p>CambiaTO (http://www.comune.torino.it/cambiato/) CambiaTO is the web 2.0 homepage of the City of Turin. Ajax based, it's highly customizable (like the Google personalized homepage) thanks to the drag and drop feature, which allow the user to move all the boxes and change the layout of the page, and to the ability for the user to choose which content he wants to be displayed. Default main contents are the RSS feed from the City of Turin's website, real-time images from the Turin's webcams, weather forecasts, traffic information, etc. I took part to the design, development and testing of this page, working together with two other web designers and one professional developer. This project lasted about 3 months.</p> <p>Circolo (http://www.comune.torino.it/circolo/) Circolo is a Drupal based community conceived by the cities of Turin, Rome and Grosseto which has the aim to bring public administrations closer to citizens (e-democracy project). The first phase of this project was only open for a closed group of users, while in the next steps the site will be accessible for everyone. The sites contains collaborative features like blog, forum, wiki, file manager, chat. Each of them was implemented using Drupal modules, which were customized to meet the project's requirements. The site also contains the e-learning platform Moodle. I worked together with 2 Drupal developers in order to implement the design and to clean the HTML code as much as possible. Then I wrote a handy guide for non-expert users, I hold some courses to train webmasters from Rome and Grosseto and I took part to the first testing phase, working close together with people from the other cities. This project lasted about one year.</p> <p>Torino Turistica – The Tourist Information site of the City of Turin (http://www.comune.torino.it/canaleturismo/en/) This section contains a lot of tourist information in four different languages (Italian, English, French, Spanish). I managed all the updates and created new sub-sections.</p> <p>Torino Espresso (http://www.comune.torino.it/torinoespresso/) Torino Espresso is a smart RSS aggregator that includes all the RSS feeds of the City of Turin's website and much more. The web application was developed from third parties. The goal was to re-design the front-end interface and clean the code. I designed the site as well as the logo, and modified the XSLT template for both the web and the mobile versions in order to match the new design. Then I worked together with a developer in order to add some features like the one that allows to display images from the Turin's webcams and other small things.</p>

- The first one, no longer live, was created on the occasion of the 2006 Italian politics elections to show the electoral results in real-time. All the results were grouped and display using clear and simple tables.
- The second one is 5T Mobile (<http://www.5t.torino.it/pda/>), which displays useful information about bus time arrivals, parking availability and traffic news. One of the goals for this project was to keep the look and feel of the main website (<http://www.5t.torino.it/5t/en/home>), but at the same time to suit the small screens of the mobile devices, keeping the page very light and easy to download also with slow connections. That is why the layout is liquid and the small glossy menu icons are the only images I've put in.
